Every September an annual action plan will be agreed by each of the forum's three sub-groups – Standards, Provision, and Workforce. These will be detailed and focussed on specific time pertinent targets. These targets will arise from the WESP's ongoing plans to achieve the seven outcomes embedded in it. Each sub group will meet formally once/ twice a term as appropriate to develop its action plan, monitor and evaluate its progress and report back to the Forum at the end of the cycle in the summer term 2019. The full Forum will meet four times a year to review progress in each of the sub-groups. The forum will have a strategic overview of the action plans and implementation of the WESP. These annual plans will be supported and co-ordinated by the LA.
