

THEME: Waste and Recycling

BACKGROUND

This session aims to explore the importance of recycling, waste reduction, and how small actions can contribute to protecting the environment.

By the end of the session, children should be able to:

- Identify what can and cannot be recycled at home and in school.
- Understand the importance of reducing waste and reusing items to minimise environmental impact.
- Sort recyclable materials correctly and understand local recycling guidelines.
- Reflect on their own waste habits, including the impact of littering, and suggest ways to improve recycling efforts both at home and in the classroom.
- Recognise how improper waste disposal, such as littering or pouring harmful substances down the drain, can affect local waterways and wildlife.
- Explain how food waste plays a part in climate change
- Give some examples of inedible food waste (food that can't be eaten)
- Describe how inedible food waste is used to generate renewable energy

If you feel that your class has a good understanding of recycling you may like to focus more on food waste minimisation using the <u>Food Waste Mission Resource</u> including the
