What does this mean?

This could mean that Brynford CP School and Lixwm CP School would join together on 1 September 2019.

If Brynford CP School and Lixwm CP School were to join together, you would stay in your schools to begin with, and would share one head teacher and one Governing Body.




What would change?

If Brynford CP School and Lixwm CP School were to join together, you would have a new school uniform and new school name.

In the future, we could ask the Council and Welsh Government for money to build an extension and remodel the school on the Brynford CP School site. This would mean Lixwm CP School would close and you would go to the new Area School in Brynford.



PRIVACY NOTICE

Flintshire County Council would like your views to help make a decision on the plan to join Brynford Community Primary School and Lixwm Community Primary from 1 September 2019.
