Stage 2 public consultation findings – draft Place Making Plan for Flint

The purpose of the consultation was to obtain views from local residents on the draft Place Making Plan for Flint. Flintshire County Council launched an online survey via 'Give My View' online platform between 27th February 2026 and 16 March 2026. Alongside this, local people had the opportunity to participate in-person at Flint Library or Flint Town Hall between 3rd March and 1st April 2026.

This summary of findings below includes responses from both online and in-person participants.

Question 1: Have you heard about Place Making work in Flint?

Question 4: Is the proposed approach (to implementing the Place Making Plan) sensible?

Two short presentations for participants to watch regarding proposed priorities and proposed approach to implementing the Place Making Plan for Flint were inserted in the online survey via Give My View. These elements of the consultation were to provide information and raise awareness and were not part of gathering responses from participants. At in-person consultation events, display materials to provide the equivalent information were left in site at consultation venues.

Key findings:

- Awareness of the Place Making Plan development work in Flint remains low amongst residents, with 82% (279 of 340) of respondents indicating that they had not previously heard about the work.
- 86% of respondents (253 of 294) stated that they had not taken part in the Phase 1 Place Making Plan consultation for Flint which was conducted in 2024.
- Responses to the proposed eight 'People' and 'Place' themed priorities (as per image/ titles below) as proposed in the draft Place Making Plan were generally positive, with 83.9% of respondents rating between 5 and 10 (out of 10) on the scale*, 38.7% of which scored 8 or over.

- Responses to the proposed approach were generally positive, with 79.8% of respondents rating between 5 and 10 (out of 10).
- 20.2% of respondent did not agree with the proposed priorities and/ or approach – all of these were from online participants.
- The opportunity to speak to officers of the Council's Regeneration Team (which is responsible for co-ordinating the development of Place Making Plans for towns

across Flintshire) led to two-way dialogue and the opportunity to check local people's understanding of the proposed Plan and approach to its delivery. This was not possible via the online consultation methodology. This may be the difference between 0% of in-person respondents awarding lower scores (4 or less – out of 10) to questions 3 and 4, than those participating via the online survey.

- 45.5% of the overall respondents to this consultation responded with a score of 8 or over (with 20.1% rating a maximum of 10 out of 10) regarding the proposed delivery approach, which includes the development of an initial 1-2-year action plan to reflect the resources available.
