## Settlement Commentary

Northop Hall is a large village which is situated close to Connah's Quay. The built form of Northop Hall is clear with definable edges. The village enjoys an attractive rural setting and benefits from a good range of services and facilities. To the south of the village on the A55 is a service station with hotel, petrol filling station, fast food restaurant and shop however access is likely to be restricted to car users. Within Connah's Quay at Ffordd Llanarth there is a large supermarket and associated shops.

## **Broadband Provision**

According to the latest OFCOM data (2013) Northop Hall post codes (where data is available) have a median average broadband range of 1.5-30+ mega bytes per second with most postcodes at an average of 2.5mbps. This level of broadband provision is very poor and many residents are likely to be unable to access broadband at all. However encouragingly those 10 postcodes that have 30+mbps could be indicative of investment into the village to enhance broadband access Accordingly it is to be expected that broadband provision in Northop Hall whilst somewhat mixed is generally very poor and constrained. This will have a negative effect on the ability of local residents seeking to access online services such as banking, post office services or online shopping.
